Born in Paris, Alexandra moved to the US at age 11. She speaks 4 languages fluently (French, Spanish, Italian, and English). She graduated Summa Cum Laude from Columbia University with a degree in Political Science. Upon graduation, Alexandra spent several



years working in television, first at CNN then MSNBC. Currently, Alexandra is co-founder and managing director of Edgemar Center for the Arts. Alexandra has been producing plays and films since 2005. She has also co-produced several films, including How To Go On A Date In Queens and Hello Herman, starring Norman Reedus from the Walking Dead, which played in theaters across the country and was available in 100 million homes on demand. She recently completed Principal Photography on her latest film, The Bandit Hound which is scheduled to be released during the 2015 Holiday season. PAUL AARON

Paul Aaron has been creating successful productions since he began his professional career as the youngest director in Broadway history. Upon moving to Hollywood, he was hired to direct his first feature film A Different Story, recognized as a groundbreaking independent comedy classic. Paul then turned his attention to the small screen when he adapted and directed William Gibson's classic The Miracle Worker for NBC. With successes in three different media under his belt, Paul continued to build one of the first major production/management companies in Hollywood under the banner of his Elsboy Entertainment which would later become Three Arts Entertainment and continues to be a major Hollywood force in talent management to this day.

Paul went on to concentrate strictly on his writing and producing career and did so with rapid success. Almost immediately, Paul created, co-wrote and executive produced the groundbreaking HBO mini-series entitled *Laurel Avenue*. He then partnered with Robert Redford to executive produce *Grand Avenue*, also for HBO.

After founding his second production company, Suntaur Entertainment, Paul made a return to independent filmmaking. In addition, Paul Aaron and Suntaur Entertainment have recently closed financing for a slate of feature films, TV series and transmedia projects, which promises to make 2015 as busy and prolific as ever for the Entertainment Company.

TYLER KONNEY

Tyler W. Konney is President of Taylor & Dodge, overseeing all operations and setting strategy for the company. He founded the company's entertainment practice, and began working on the distribution of feature films after experiencing firsthand the deficiency of efficient monetization available to the producers of feature films. Mr. Konney has facilitated the development of original concepts, the financing of new projects, and the distribution of over sixty feature films in the international and domestic market. Mr. Konney received his bachelor's degree from The University of Southern California.

FADIK SEVIN ATASOY

Fadik Sevin Atasoy is an award winning actress, author and a public figure of Turkey. Coming from a family of actors, she began her acting career at the age of four in the National Theater. There, she was the youngest to win the best actress award from the Seljuk Theater Festival. Fadik continued her career as a child star with her own show on Turkish National Broadcast. She has received B.A. and M.A. degrees from the Faculty of Music and Performing Arts, Bilkent University, Ankara. After graduating, Fadik became the leading actress of the Turkish National Theatre in where she performed as the lead in seven plays, some of which also toured throughout Europe. These plays include All of My Sons, Miser, and The Cherry Orchard, among others.

DENNIS CHRISTOPHER

Dennis Christopher is a stage and screen actor that has filmed with directors: Frederico Fellini (ROMA), Jim Bridges (SEPTEMBER 30,1955), Robert Altman (3 WOMEN and A WEDDING), Peter Yates (BREAKING AWAY), William Friedkin (CRIMINAL MINDS), Henry Jaglom (QUEEN OF THE LOT) and Quentin Tarantino (DJANGO UNCHAINED). He has starred in 3 Academy Award winning films and many independents, documentaries and shorts. He has one Golden Globe nomination and one BAFTA win. Christopher continues to act on Broadway, regional and waver theater as well as writes, directs, and coaches.

As a development executive she supervised television and film deals at Warner Brothers and Twentieth Century Fox, and a feature film distribution deal at PFG Entertainment.

Gilels has also taught at USC Film School Writer's Program and been a guest lecturer at UCLA Extension School and LA Film School. She was a judge for the screenplay competition of the 2007 LA Greek Film Festival and has been an active board member for the LA Femme Film Festival for the past 8 years. At La Femme, Deborah has been in charge of the educational aspect of the festival, including all panels, seminars and special screenings, as well as corporate sponsorship.

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STEVEN BERNSTEIN

Director Steven Bernstein DGA, ASC wrote and directed the award winning feature film *Decoding Annie Parker* and also won The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Feature Film Award at The Hamptons International Film Festival. Bernstein was a 2013 nominee for The ASC Award for Outstanding Achievement in Cinematography for his work on *Magic City*.

Bernstein began his film career as a cinematographer in the United Kingdom, first doing documentaries, then commercials (for which he won several awards including the Cannes Golden Lion). He went on to shoot many landmark feature films for both studios and independents including the highly acclaimed *Like Water For Chocolate* and the Oscar winning *Monster*.

He is also the author of the best selling book "Film Production" about the process of film making. He has authored several other books and screen-plays and his new film about Dylan Thomas, *Dominion* from his original screenplay, starring Rhys Ifans, John Malkovich, Romola Garai, Rodrigo Santoro, Tony Hale and Zosia Mamet, will be released in 2015.



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
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
